In February, we passed a big milestone with over 200 GSE Champions (you now total 204) signed up to raising the profile of GSE! This time last year, the network totalled around 80 — we are growing fast.

1) Champions Networking Event, NPL, 23 May 2018 – Save the Date!

The GSE Team will be running a networking event for Champions at the National Physical Laboratory (NPL), on Wednesday 23 May. If you were a Champion this time last year, you may have attended a similar event at the Met Office HQ in Exeter. From your feedback, you really enjoyed the chance to meet other Champions, hear stories and advice from a diverse panel, and share both your praise and grievances with the network, and this year you will have similar opportunities, with science talks and tours, a panel discussion, and a workshop session (and, of course, a free lunch). **A full agenda will be circulated closer to the time.**

The event will take place at the National Physical Laboratory in Teddington, south-west London on Wednesday, 23 May (<u>directions</u>). You should have received a placeholder Outlook invite last week for the event, so **please accept or decline the invitation** so we know how many will be attending.

4) Centenary of Women's Suffrage



2018 is the celebration of the <u>centenary of women's suffrage</u> in the UK, and GSE are proud to support the campaign. 6) Complete the Chartership and Accreditation Survey

A few months ago, we circulated a survey about chartership and accreditation to Champions, looking for your views on a routemap project the GSE team are currently developing. The project fulfils goals in the GSE Strategy to "promote the benefits of professional accreditation in science and engineering and … the importance of achieving chartered status and other professional standards."

We have currently only had 19 responses to the survey out of 204 Champions. We know we can do better and aim for 100% Champions completion, so if you have not yet completed it, please do so — it is really important to us and will only take a few minutes. We will adjust the survey based on your responses before opening it up to the nearly 3000-strong cohort of GSE members, and your feedback will shape our plans for this work going forward, so your completing the survey would be very much appreciated.



7) Social Mobility Foundation – Support the Next Generation of Aspiring Scientists

The Social Mobility Foundation are looking for scientists to e-mentor the bright, young people they work with from disadvantaged backgrounds. From a State of the Nation <u>report</u>, students on Free School Meals are 19% less likely to attend university, and 22% less likely to study a STEM degree.



The Social Mobility Foundation (SMF) is a national

charity that aims to make a practical improvement in social mobility for high-achieving young people from low-income backgrounds. With the help of professionals, they support more than 1500 young people every year who have the ability to flourish in top universities and professions but who lack the encouragement and networks to help them get there.

As an e-mentor, you would support a sixth former by giving them the opportunity to have a 1:1 relationship with a STEM professional, particularly with a biology or chemistry background, who can communicate with them via email every two weeks. Mentors support students in a number of ways, including by increasing their understanding of their desired career and professional life. The mentoring relationship is extremely valuable in helping to guide mentees through their time on the SMF programme, their university applications, and in helping them to further explore their professional interests.
